Collections

The Kathrine R. Everett Law Library houses a rich collection of law and law-related materials to support the research and teaching of the UNC Law School community, and the larger University of North Carolina-Chapel Hill community. The library is also open to lawyers and other members of the public.

Print Collection

Most of the Law Library's print collection is available for all to use, although much of it does not circulate outside the library. The print collection contains materials in the following categories: United States federal and state law collections; foreign and international collections; government publications; and special collections and rare books. Please see the specific webpage for each of these collections for more information about the contents of these collections and their locations in the Law Library.

Online Collection

There is also a rich and growing collection of legal information available online; however, access to this information varies widely. Online information is accessible several ways. Wireless internet access is available throughout the library. There are also a number of public internet terminals available near the library entrance where online legal information may be accessed.

Access to online information may depend upon your status as a library patron. Some online information is restricted through license agreements to law students and faculty only. Other information may be restricted to those with University affiliation. Where possible, database licenses have been negotiated to provide the widest possible access.
