Computer-Assisted Legal Instruction (CALI)

Topical Research Guides

The Law Library provides research guides designed to help library users locate materials on specific topics. Copies of the research guides are available at the Reference Desk.

LexisNexis and Westlaw

LexisNexis and Westlaw, the largest electronic legal research systems, are available to UNC-CH law students for academic use. LexisNexis and Westlaw printers are located outside of the Library in the third floor student area. Passwords were distributed during orientation. The reference staff can answer questions about research techniques or the limitations of use outlined in the library's subscription.
